Biographies

Luca Bader is the executive director of the Institute of European Democrats. After finishing undergraduate and postgraduate studies in International Relations at the London School of Economics in 2000, Luca Bader moved to Rome to take up the position of Senior Research Fellow at the Italian Institute of International Affairs (IAI). His research at the IAI focused on the international economy, EU-US relations, and EU foreign policy. In addition he has been a research collaborator with the departments of Political Science at the University of Milan. In 2004, he began working for the European Democratic Party (EDP-PDE) in the European Parliament with responsibility for expanding the party's membership in Europe and developing relations with aligned political parties, including the US Democratic Party and democratic parties across Asia. At the same time, Luca Bader was also appointed Head of International Relations of the Margherita Party in Italy. Since 2006, Luca Bader has advised several Italian ministries and private companies on EU and international affairs. He also writes regularly on Italian and EU affairs for a range of Italian publications.

Etienne Beeker is an expert economist engineer for power and energy systems at the department for sustainable development, Centre d'Analyse Stratégique, under the French Prime Minister authority. Previously, he worked for EDF, Electricité de France, the French utility, ADEME, the French agency for energy efficiency and renewable energy. He is graduate from the Ecole Polytechnique (1972) with a specialization degree in computer science from the University of Paris (1980). He is currently working on the assessment of the profitability for the society of the electrical vehicle, on the design of long term energy scenarios, mainly with respect to CO2 emissions constraints, and on the interest of Smart Grids for Power Systems. He has recently written a paper on shale gases.

Nikolaos Bilios is a senior policy analyst and special advisor at the Cabinet of State Minister (PM Office) of the Hellenic Republic. He is the responsible for Foreign Direct Investments, State & Governance Affairs. Previously he was an operations officer and policy analyst at Citizens' Union PAREMVASSI think tank. He was also a European Marshall Memorial Fellow with the German Marshall Fund of the U.S. He has worked as research assistant and Visiting Fellow at the LSE and has managed consulting and auditing companies, worked on NGO programs for the European Commission, and planned economic and administrative policies for the Greek government. Mr Bilios studied social sciences and politics at the University of London and he specialized in political sociology, international relations and public administration at the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE) (Dip., MSc., MPhil/PhD).

Piotr Ciećwierz is deputy director of economic diplomacy department, Ministry of Foreign Affairs. He is a former director of the foreign investments and export promotion Department in the Ministry of Economy and chairman of the supervisory board of the Polish information and Foreign investments Agency. He worked at MOFA (91-97 DCM in the Embassy of Poland in Kuwait) from 1988 to 1999 (back since 2005), at the Chancellery of the Prime Minister (Foreign Affairs Department) from 2002 to 2004, and then at the Ministry of Economy. He holds a degree from the Moscow State Institute of International Relations (MGIMO), a MA in Political Sciences (International Relations) with specialization in Middle East & North Africa, and a MBA in International Finances.

Piotr Czyżewski is a Former Minister of Treasury, Republic of Poland.

Iana Dreyer is a trade policy and world economy analyst focusing on Europe and emerging economies. She has worked for several years in Brussels at the world economy think tank European Centre for International Political Economy. She currently works independently in Paris. She has so far advised and written for various research institutions in Europe, notably the London School of Economics Trade Policy Unit and the EU Institute for Security Studies. Her core areas of interest are the current economic globalisation process, the economies of emerging markets (especially Russia and China), the EU's economic and commercial diplomacy, and Europe's relationships with Russia/Eastern neighbourhood and with China/wider Asia. She has an extensive knowledge of the economics, politics and content of bilateral trade and investment agreements and of the multilateral trading system (WTO), with a special focus on energy, ICT goods, and services. She has written for ECIPE, the *Wall Street Journal*, *European Voice*, *Europe's World*, the *European Energy Review*, *Bloomberg Businessweek* and various *Financial Times* Group publications. Iana Dreyer is a graduate from the London School of Economics and from Sciences Po Paris. She is a dual French and German citizen.

Martin Ehl is a political analyst and since 2006 has been head of the foreign desk of the Czech business daily *Hospodářské Noviny*. Previously he worked in various Czech written media since 1992, also collaborating with TV and radio. His articles have been published also in the Serbian, Slovak and Polish press. His area of expertise includes Central Europe, Balkans, security policy, transatlantic relations, globalization, Latin America and Spain. He is the author of several books and he also hosts a blog on the *lhned.cz* website. Mr. Ehl holds a Ph.D. in political science (Charles University, Prague. Thesis: Globalization and political culture). In 1999 he was a research fellow at Institute of International Relations, Prague, and from 2001 to 2006 he was lecturer at University of West Bohemia Pilsen teaching "Global issues and problems". He has numerous fellowships and took professional courses in USA, Poland, Hungary, Belgium, Italy, Slovenia.

Mariusz Kawnik is senior energy expert at the EU & International relations Unit of the Department of Energy of the Ministry of Economy of Poland. His current post: (starting 1st May 2011) is "Energy Attaché in the Permanent Representation of Poland to the EU". Previously he was chief coordinator of the interministerial team responsible for the preparations to the Polish Presidency in the sphere of energy (2009-2011), and as such he was the author and person responsible for the preparations of the Polish Presidency's central priority - "Strengthening the external dimension of the EU energy policy". In 2007 and 2008 he was, respectively, coordinator of the negotiating team (Directive on identification of European Critical Infrastructures) and coordinator of the negotiating team (Directive on promotion of renewable energy sources). Mr. Kawnik main area of expertise are: 1) EU energy affairs; 2) The bilateral relations between Poland - Russia, Belarus and Ukraine in the sphere of electricity. He studied International Relations specializing in political sciences at the University of Lodz.

François Lafond is the director of the Paris office director of The German Marshall Fund of the United States (since July 2008). Most recently, François Lafond was a special advisor of the Italian Minister for Regional Affairs and Local Autonomies, responsible for international relations of the think tank Glocus in Roma, and associate professor at the Centre for European Studies of Sciences-Po Paris (2001-). Previously, he was special adviser of the Italian undersecretary of State for Foreign Affairs (2006-7), deputy director of Policy Network in London (2003-6), researcher and then deputy secretary general of the think tank Notre Europe in Paris (1999-2003), then chaired by Jacques Delors, and research associate at the European University Institute's Robert Schuman Centre in Florence (1995-9). Lafond hold a diploma from Institut d'études politiques de Grenoble and has 3 master's degrees in political science, public law and European studies. He is also a former trainee from the European Commission in Brussels (1990). François Lafond has published on European policy and regulatory issues including biotechnology, bioethics, and food safety, and on Transatlantic affairs. He is also a weekly commentator of the French International news TV *France 24* and a regular collaborator of the daily Italian Newspaper *Europa*.

Thomas Legge is energy program officer at *The German Marshall Fund*, Washington. His work has included managing projects on competitiveness impacts of an emission trading system. He previously worked on environmental policy for Chatham House, the Royal Institute of International Affairs in London; the Centre for European Policy Studies in Brussels, and Comhar-Sustainable Development Council, an advisory body to the Irish Government. His recent publications include: "Cancun and the discovery of the lost, limited art of climate diplomacy", GMF, 10 December 2010.

Jeffrey Mankoff is International affairs fellow at U.S Department of State. Previously he was Associate Director of International Security Studies at Yale University and adjunct fellow for Russia studies at the Council on Foreign Relations (CFR). Dr. Mankoff has written on a range of topics connected to post-Soviet politics and foreign policy. He is the author of the book *Russian Foreign Policy: The Return of Great Power Politics*, as well as numerous journal articles and op-eds. His areas of functional expertise include great power relations, foreign policy decision making, ethnic conflict, and energy security. In addition to research, he has taught classes at Yale on Russian foreign policy, as well as modern diplomatic and military history. He received his PhD and

MPhil in history and his MA in political science from Yale, and his BA in international studies and Russian from the University of Oklahoma.

Pawel Piskorski is the chairman of Alliance of Democrats, Poland. He was Mayor of Warsaw (March 1999-January 2002). Previously, in 1997 he was elected to the Sejm from the Unia Wolności electoral list, and in 2001, after participating in a secession from that party, he successfully ran under the Civic Platform banner. In 2004 he was the Secretary General of Civic Platform. He has been elected member of the European Parliament in 2004.

Michele Porri is head of business improvement and origination at the International Division of ENEL spa. He has managed projects in Romania, Belgium, France, Kosovo and Albania. Previously he was assistant to the managing director for development activities at Falck Group (1999-2006), and previously a consultant for The Lek Partnership (1997-9). He worked at the Società per l'Imprenditorialità Giovanile (1995-7). He holds a degree in Business Administration from the University of Rome "Tor Vergata".

Andrzej Szczęśniak is an Oil & Gas industry expert who has worked in the industry since 1991. He was President of the Polish Chamber of Liquid Fuels (1995-2001) and executive President of Konsorcjum Gdańskie S.A. - involved in the privatization of Gdansk Refinery (1999-2002). He also worked for the Polish LPG Association (2002-2006). In 2006 he entered in Lotos Group S.A. and was CEO of Lotos Partner sp. z o.o. He is now with NaftaGaz.pl.

Tibor Szanyi is a Socialist member of the Hungarian parliament and former Political State Secretary in the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development and the Ministry of Economy and Transport. He's a board member of the London-based international think tank Policy Network. He is a graduate of the Karl Marx University in international trade, and in 1980 got his doctorate degree.
