Ivan Štefanec is a Member of the European Parliament since 2014 and a member of numerous committees and delegations, including the Committee on the Internal Market and the Delegation to the Euronest Parliamentary Assembly as well as the Delegation to the EU-Ukraine Parliamentary Association Committee (euoparl.europa.eu). Previously, Mr. Štefanec has held different high-level management positions in the private sector and has served as Governmental plenipotentiary for the introduction of the euro and as Member of the National Council of the Slovak Republic from 2006 until his election to the European Parliament.



Alojz Baránik was elected Member of the National Council of the Slovak Republic in 2016 for the political party Freedom and Solidarity (Sloboda a Solidarita) for the legislative term of 2016-2020. Mr. Baránik is member of the Judicial Committee of the National Council of the Slovak Republic and a lawyer by profession having graduated from the Faculty of Law at the Comenius University in Bratislava in 1977.



Hristo Ivanov, Chairman of Da, Bulgaria Movement. He is a Bulgarian politician, lawyer and former Minister of Justice and Vice Prime Minister of Bulgaria between August and November 2014. After attending the Sofia University he graduated in law. He specialised in Washington College of Law in national security law and in procedures of legal appointments in the USA. Ivanov has worked as a coordinator of projects in the fields of the legislative and the judicial reform in the framework of the Rule of Law Initiative of the American Bar Association. He worked as a Program Director of the Bulgarian Institute for Legal Initiatives Foundation, where he coordinated projects in the field of legal reform, prevention of corruption and establishing rule of law.

Andrzej Potocki, PhD (born 1964), philosopher and writer, member of Polish Parliament 1991-2001, head and political officer of numerous OSCE missions in the Balkans and Middle East, EDP vice-president since 2010, vice-president and international secretary of Stronnictwo Demokratyczne (SD), he presents internationally the SiD Foundation (Fundacja Samorządność i Demokracja), which is a member organisation of the IED. Besides politics and history of ideas he writes books on history of football and on crime novels in communist era.



Tibor Kabai, founding member and co-chairman of the party Nyugdíjasok Pártja 50+ (Hungary). He was the President of SZB, founder and operator of voluntary pension and health funds from 1994 till today, he has also been an entrepreneur. Amateur runner, he has completed the half marathon several times. Nyugdíjasok Pártja 50+ (Hungary) is a member organization of IED.



Jakub Jaraczewski studied law at Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznań. Currently he is a Legal Officer at Democracy Reporting International, a Berlin-based NGO/think-tank. He works on the rule of law as part of the re: constitution programme.
